trash receptacles and have easy access allowing students to place recycling in the proper disposal area with little effort. In residential halls, each room should have a small receptacle, such as a crate to allow students to dispose of recycling in their rooms with ease. When filled, students should be educated to empty these crates into the larger receptacles in the main hallways, to be collected by Building and Grounds. From there, B&G should take the bags of recycling to an area to be collected by the off-campus organization (STEPS Inc).

SECTION IV:

Phase One: To be completed as soon as possible. All academic, administrative buildings, and one residential area such as the Blakes Apartments on campus property will have recycling bins. Each academic and administrative building should have at least one recycling receptacle well labeled in a central location on each floor. Each Blake Apartment will have its own small sized bin to collect recyclables for that building and will be emptied by students into central receptacles when full. Phase Two: Starting the 2019-2020 school year, each residential hall will have a main recycling receptacle on each floor and each hallway. Dormitories should have small receptacles in each room for students to easily collect recyclables. Students will be educated and aware of how to properly collect recycling and dispose of their smaller bins into the central receptacle located on each hall. Each house on fraternity circle should have multiple large recycling containers available and the plastic bottles and aluminum cans should be properly disposed of by the fraternities as it is their duty to clean all party trash.

SECTION V:

Purposefully failing to recycle when available, littering on campus grounds, or the abuse of a recycling receptacle should fall under a code of conduct violation, and the violator will receive disciplinary consequences.
